18	(B) Limitation on use of seed money. Seed Money collected by Applicant				
19	Candidates under the provisions of the Open and Ethical Elections Code, in				
20	addition to the limitations contained in that Code, shall be subject to the				
21	following limitations:				
22	(1) All goods and services received prior to certification must be				
23	paid for with Seed Money contributions, except for goods and				
24	services that are excluded from the definition of contribution in				
25	Article XIII, Section 2, subsection g. It is a violation of this ordinance				
26	for a Participating Candidate to use Fund revenues received after				
27	certification to pay for goods and services received prior to				
28	certification.				
29	(2) Prior to certification, an Applicant Candidate may obligate an				
30	amount greater than the Seed Money collected, but may only receive				

ay obligate an may only receive that portion of goods and services that has been paid for or will be paid for with Seed Money. An Applicant Candidate who has accepted contributions or made Expenditures that do not comply with the

1	Seed Money restrictions under this chapter may petition the Clerk to
2	remain eligible for certification as a Participating Candidate if the
3	failure to comply was unintentional and does not constitute a
4	significant infraction of these restrictions.
5	(3) An Applicant Candidate or Participating Candidate who
6	receives a contribution exceeding the Seed Money per donor
7	restriction or the total amount restriction must immediately return
8	the contribution and may not otherwise use the contribution.
9	SECTION 9. Chapter 2, Article 4, is amended to add Part 21 as follows:
10	§ 2-4-21 MAINTENANCE OF CAMPAIGN IN OFF YEARS FOR PUBLICALLY
11	FINANCED CANDIDATES.
12	A person may solicit and accept contributions, not to exceed \$100 per
13	Person, for the purpose of financing costs related to maintenance of a
14	campaign during an election cycle in which the person is not a candidate
15	as follows:
16	(A) A person who accepts donations for these purposes must establish
17	a candidate finance committee and appoint a treasurer who is responsible
18	for keeping records of donations and for filing a financial disclosure
19	statement required by this section. All donations received must be
20	deposited in a separate and segregated account and may not be
21	commingled with any contributions received by any candidate or political
22	committee or any personal or business funds of any person.

- (B) A committee established pursuant to this section shall register and file a financial disclosure statement with the City Clerk as required by this subsection.
- (C) The committee shall register with the City Clerk within 10 days after appointment of a treasurer. The registration must include the name and mailing addresses of the members of the committee, and the treasurer.
- (D) The financial disclosure statement must contain the names, addresses, occupations and employers of all donors who have given money or anything of value, including in-kind donations of goods or services, along with the amounts and dates of the donations.

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(E) Any outstanding loan, debt or other obligation of the committee must 1 2 be disclosed as a donation. 3 (F) The financial disclosure statement must identify the amounts, dates, payees and purposes of all payments made by the committee. 4 5 (G) Financial disclosure statements must be filed in accordance with 6 Article XII, Section 4, Subsection 2(A). (H) A committee established pursuant to this section may accept 7 8 contributions until the following deadlines: i. For Mayoral candidates, 287 days before an election in which the 9 individual benefitted by the committee seeks to be a candidate where the 10 11 person is a candidate: and ii. For Council candidates, 203 days before an election in which the 12 13 individual benefitted by the committee seeks to be a candidate where the 14 person is a candidate. 15 (I) The registration of a committee established pursuant to this section shall expire each year on December 31st. A committee established 16 17 pursuant to this section shall renew its registration with the City Clerk upon the later of expiration or within five days of any contribution 18 19 collection or expenditure by the committee that is in excess of \$250. 20 (J) Any unspent funds remaining in the committee's account as of the first day of the Exploratory period shall be forfeited to the Fund. 21 22 (K) Contributions to a committee pursuant to this section shall count 23 towards the aggregate and per Person limits on seed money. 24 SECTION 10. Article III, Section 3 is amended as follows: (a)(6) If the Council fails to act upon a measure so proposed within fourteen 25 26 days after the City Clerk files a certification with the Council that the 27 petition has been signed by the required number of voters, or the Council 28 acts adversely thereon or substantively amends it an election on the issues 29 must be held at the next general election or regular municipal election. (b) Subject to state law and Secretary of State rules regarding ballot 30 31 questions, at such election the ballot shall contain the proposed measure

as originally submitted and the measure as amended, if substantively

	10	validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council hereby
	11	declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section,
	12	paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any
	13	provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
	14	SECTION 12. COMPILATION. Sections 1 through 9 of this ordinance shall
	15	amend, be incorporated in and made part of the City Charter and Revised
	16	Ordinances of Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.
