**Federal Fiscal Year 2021 City of Albuquerque List of Federal Policy Priorities**

**Consideration is Requested for the Following Policy Objectives**

*America's Transportation Infrastructure Act*

Creating a program to assist with the implementation and maintenance of free-fare Transit Policies and Programs.

Diversify the funding stream for the Federal Highway and Transit Programs to adjust to revenue losses due to declining federal gas tax revenues.

*Behavioral Health*

Legislation supporting sharing of federal data with state and local agencies, and organizations working to end homelessness, reintegrate previously incarcerated citizens back into the community, and end the cycle of coming in and out of the hospital.

*Environmental Protection*

National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Compliance: Create grant programs to assist local agencies in implementing best practices and infrastructure projects to comply with the requirements established in the "Regional Storm Water Discharge Permit" issued under the NPDES.

*Grant Oversight Review*

Grant Program Oversight: Legislation strengthening Congresses ability to review compliance of the disposition of a grant program with the intent of the legislation establishing the grant program and that would provide Congress the authority to intervene to correct noncompliance with the enabling legislation in the disposition of grants.

*Immigration Reform*

Enact just and humane immigration reforms that provide immigrants and their families with rights in this country that respect their human dignity and their status as taxpayers and contributing members of the community.

*Housing*

Land Banks: Adopt legislation that creates grants to establish land banks for acquiring bighted or underutilized land in at risk neighborhoods and to promote the development of properties within land banks in a productive manner that improves the social network of the community, including establishing standards for construction, underwriting and loans insurance made by banks and other private lenders for home building on properties held within land banks.

*Kirtland Air Force Base*

Continue support for the organizations and their missions that are located at Kirtland Air Force Base.

*Public Health*

Updating Laws and Regulations and Improving Public Health Funding to Address Rising Challenges to the Public's Health and to Better Utilize New Developments in the Field of Public Health.
