WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued
Executive Order 2020-004, Order Declaring a State of Public Health Emergency
relating to the spread of COVID-19; and

7 WHEREAS, in subsequent weeks the New Mexico Department of Health
8 issued orders limiting public gatherings and requiring non-essential
9 businesses to close or limit business activity; and

WHEREAS, those experiencing homelessness, and those precariously
housed face additional challenges due to the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS, unanticipated loss of income and job-related health care may cause thousands of Albuquerque residents to be at greater risk of becoming homeless or precariously housed, suffering from decreasing availability of support services, continuing bills, and unanticipated health costs; and

WHEREAS, through Resolution R-20-30, the City Council reallocated funds from the City Clerk to be used for COVID-19 needs, including but not limited to grants to non-profits providing food, shelter, and health services for lowincome and at-risk residents whose economic situation has been negatively impacted by the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic.

SUBJECT: Resolution Appropriating Funds for the Coronavirus Community Support and Recovery Program

Approval is requested to appropriate funding for the Coronavirus Community Support and Recovery Program in the amount of \$1,000,000 to the Coronavirus Community Support and Recovery Fund pursuant to R-20-30 and signed on April 22, 2020.

The process for soliciting and reviewing offers is following an expedited timeline. A Request for Proposals (RFP) is being issued on April 26, 2020 (due May 8, 2020) to solicit offers to address the unanticipated loss of income, the loss of job-related health care, the decreasing availability of support services, continuing bills, and unanticipated health costs. The needs will be addressed through contracts to provide food, shelter and health services for low-income and at-risk residents whose economic situation has been negatively impacted by the 2020 COVID-19 epidemic.

The RFP process follows the emergency procurement provisions of the Family and Community Services (FCS) Procurement Rule. The FCS Department will review past performance of offerors who have had contracts with FCS over the previous three years and provide this information to the Coronavirus Community Support and Recovery Fund Oversight Committee per R-20-30. The Oversight Committee will make the final recommendation of contract awards with review and approval by the City Council on May 18, 2020. The attached legislation will include the recommended contract awards once determined by the Oversight Committee.

The attached Resolution is forwarded to City Council for approval.
