- 5 PART 2: BIOLOGICAL PARK ADVISORY BOARD
- § 10-2-2-1 PURPOSE. 6
- 7 The Albuquerque Biological Park Advisory Board, hereinafter referred to as
- 8 the "Board" is established for the following purposes:
- 9 (A) To support the development and operation of the Albuquergue Biological
- Park which includes [three primary facilities, being,] the [Albuquerque 10

[(A) There is hereby created an Albuquerque Biological Park Advisory Board 20

- 21 which shall consist of nine members, each primary facility within the Park being
- 22 represented by three members. If the Board deems necessary, three
- 23 subcommittees, one for each primary facility, may be established.
- (B) The terms of the members of the Board shall be for three year terms 24

- 6 Foundation," a nonprofit corporation formed to further the cultural and
- 7 educational programs and purposes of the Museum as expressed in city
- 8 ordinances relating to the Museum.

- 10 § 10-4-1-4 BOARD COMPOSITION[; TERMS; MINUTES.
- 11 (A) The Board will be composed of nine members, each of whom is
- 12 appointed to fill a designated position. All appointments require the advice and
- 13 consent of the City Council. It is intended that the areas of art and history will
- 14 be represented by membership on the Board. (For the nomination- appointment
- 15 procedure, see § <u>10-4-1-5.</u>)
- 16 (1) Two of the Board members shall be appointed by the Mayor from at
- 17 least four names submitted to the Mayor by the Museum Foundation. An
- additional member appointed by the Mayor shall be the President of the

- for public funds in determining the financing of the Museum by the city. 2

3 (D) The Director is empowered to expend funds from the Museum Trust and

Agency Account in accordance with applicable city practices. 4

7 (A) The City Council will assume the cost of operating the Museum,

8 specifically, salaries of staff and employees, costs of preparing exhibitions,

maintenance of building and grounds, and other related costs and services. 9

10 (B) Costs of acquisition of collections and similar material for the Museum

11 will not normally be paid for by the city unless special funds are made available

12 to the city by grants, endowments, gifts or by Council action. The Museum may

13 charge admission fees. For special projects which are beyond the usual

14 operating activities of the Museum, hereinafter "special project," the Museum

may request special funds from the City and/or grants from outside 15

sources. The request for a grant may include all the costs of the special 16

17 project. Thus, if a special project requires additional personnel or special

18 equipment exclusively for that project, the grant may encompass the expenses 19 as costs arising from that project, expenses which the Museum would not otherwise undertake. 20

21 (C) Admission fee levels shall be set by the Mayor, in consultation with the 22 Board, pursuant to the following policies:

23 (1) Fees should not be so high as to seriously reduce the availability of the 24 Museum to the public;

25 (2) Fees should be reasonable in relation to other museum and educational 26 attractions in the Southwest region;

27 (3) Compatible, reciprocal fees with the New Mexico Museum of Natural 28 History are desirable;

29 (4) In keeping with the museum's educational role, special fee provisions 30 should apply to students;

31 (5) Special fee provisions should apply to senior citizens and Museum 32 Foundation members;

33 (6) There should be periodic free days.

SUBJECT: Standardizing Board and Commission Appointment Processes and Staff Relations for Cultural Services Divisions and Venues

The Cultural Services Department has been evaluating the current appointment process and board/staff relations within each section of Chapter 10 of the City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances. The attached legislation is a comprehensive revision of nearly all boards and commissions within Chapter 10 to standardize not only the board appointment process for each division/venue, but to eliminate outdated references to proposed or existing cultural entities that are no longer under the auspices of municipal government.

The appointment process for the Library Advisory Board and the Albuquerque Arts Board served as the primary model for the standardization of appointments to assure greater accountability and responsiveness for each City Councilor, while providing the Mayor with the broader stakeholder appointments including at-large members and the assignment of membership positions among the various support organizations, such as the New Mexico BioPark Society and the Albuquerque Museum Foundation, as well as the multitude of interests at the Anderson/Abruzzo Albuquerque International Balloon Museum.

This legislation also reconciles all Duties and Responsibilities with the overarching Board and Commissions Ordinance clarifying the Open Meeting Act, Conflict of Interests and emphasizing that all boards shall develop Bylaws that govern each Board. Cultural Services staff will work to standardize the various board bylaws to assure proper board governance.
