- but only to list all of these properties as priorities for the City.

- utilization of up to \$2,200,000 in funds from the Open Space Trust Fund and
- provided any use of Open Space Trust Funds is the minimal amount
- necessary to complete the acquisition.

Cover Analysis

1. What is it? City Ordinance (2-6-16) requires the City Council to approve a list of priority properties suitable for acquisition through purchase, exchange, or any suitable mechanism for purposes of "major public open space." The Major Public Open Space (MPOS) priority acquisition list has not been updated since 2015. The Open Space Advisory Board (OSAB) has approved three properties for addition to the list, subject to approval by City Council.

2. What will this piece of legislation do? Add three properties to the Major Public Open Space priority acquisition list: Calabacillas Pueblo II, Diamond Rock/Four Hills, and Poole Property. This legislation would also authorize use of up to \$2.2M from the Open Space Trust Fund to acquire one of the properties (Poole property), if such funds were necessary to complete the acquisition.

3. Why is this project needed? Per Ordinance 2-6-16, the properties must be added to the list by City Council in order for the City to move forward with acquisition. One project, acquisition of the Poole property, faces some time constraints and would require the City to expend approximately \$2M that would be combined with prior state appropriations of \$4.56M. While the City is considering all possible funding sources, authorization to use the Open Space Trust Fund would give the City additional flexibility to complete the acquisition.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source? Simply adding the three properties to the MPOS Priority Acquisition List does not require or guarantee appropriations or expenditures. If the City used funds from the Open Space Trust Fund, it could cost up to \$2.2M from that source.

5. Is there a revenue source associated? If so, what level of income is projected? Acquisition of Major Public Open Space is funded by a 2% set-aside in the City's General Obligation Bond, impact fees, earnings from the Open Space Trust Fund, state grants, and other sources.

6. What will happen if the project is not approved? If not added to the MPOS Priority Acquisition List, the three properties will not be eligible for acquisition by the City as Major Public Open Space. Without authorization to use the Open Space Trust Fund, the City may not be able to complete acquisition of the Poole property. If not acquired, the three properties could developed and their environmental/conservation/open space values could be lost forever.
