14	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque, will submit the certification required
15	for direct payment of federal Funds as established under Subtitle B - Housing
16	Provisions, Section 3205 - Homelessness Assistance and Supportive Services
17	Program of the America Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA); and
18	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque will request direct payment of
19	Homelessness Assistance and Supportive Services Program estimated at
20	\$7,600,000 for which the development and support of affordable housing is an

24	Pandemic Response and Support for Vulnerable Populations and encouraging

2	Department of Finance and Administration and local partners, announced on
3	April 15, 2021, that it will administer \$24,000,000 in federal funds for Emergency
4	Rental Assistance; and
5	WHEREAS, \$6,000,000 for Housing Vouchers was proposed in the FY21
6	Operating Budget; and this resolution proposes to appropriate additional
7	\$1,340,000 for Housing Vouchers, Eviction Prevention & Domestic Violence using
8	ARPA funding; and
9	WHEREAS, The City of Albuquerque appropriated \$3,300,000 for the
10	Affordable Housing in the FY21 Capital Program, and this resolution proposes an
11	additional \$3,400,000 for Affordable Housing and \$3,300,000 for Home

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

Approve and authorize the City to receive and use direct funding from Title III and Title IX of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

3. Why is the project needed?

Title III funding will be used for the purpose of planning, designing and constructing Affordable Housing Projects and other homeless assistance and supportive services for fiscal years 2022 through 2025.

Title IX funding will be used to cover costs incurred by the City to respond to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19) or its negative economic impacts; to respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID–19 public health emergency; and to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID–19 public health emergency in fiscal years 2022 through 2024.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

There is no cost or matching required to receive this funding.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?
