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- successful purchase and development of a dual use balloon landing and sports field at Osuna and Vista Del Norte. The task force identified multiple properties in the North Valley as landing field candidates.
 - Acquire multiple small sized properties for balloon landing sites and other recreational activities. The task force identified a number of small lots throughout the North Valley and the North I-25 Corridor to purchase and convert for landing.
 - Continue to develop the "X Marks the Spot Program". Balloon Fiesta Staff expanded the program as part of the study effort. Through the program land owners are recruited to place, an "X" made of bed sheets on open areas of their property, to notify balloonists they may land on the site.
 - Development of Balloon Landing Site Application. Albuquerque Geographical Information System Staff, Balloon Fiesta Staff and Council Staff developed an interactive map app to guide balloon pilots to landing sites. This was part of the identification of available and potential landing sites for the study. The map is downloaded onto cell phones and the pilots can use it to identify landing sites that are safe for landings and where the landowner has provided permission to do so.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:

- SECTION 1. The Balloon Landing Task Force Report, Attachment 1 to this Resolution, is hereby accepted by the City Council.
- SECTION 2. The City Council urges the seating of a City Staff and Public Working Group to develop action plans to implement the recommendations in the Balloon Landing Task Force Report to achieve ample landing areas for balloonists participating in events in Albuquerque.
