3	AVAILABLE FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 FOR THE					
4	PURPOSES OF PANDEMIC RESPONSE, PANDEMIC RECOVERY INVESTMENTS,					
5	AND SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE POPULATIONS.					
6	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque, will submit the certification required					
7	for direct payment of federal funds as established under Subtitle M, Section 9901					
8	- Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds of the America Rescue Plan					
9	Act of 2021 (ARPA); and					
10	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque will request direct payment of					
11	Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds estimated at \$56,760,000					
12	which represents one-half of the allocation to the city and is available within 60					
13	days of the enactment of ARPA or May 11, 2021; and					
14	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque, will submit the certification required					
15	for direct payment of federal funds as established under Subtitle B - Housing					
16	Provisions, Section 3205 - Homelessness Assistance and Supportive Services					
17	Program of the America Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA); and					
18	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque will request direct payment of					
19	Homelessness Assistance and Supportive Services Program estimated at					
20	\$7,600,000 for which the development and support of affordable housing is an					
21	eligible and feasible use but for which housing rehabilitation is not a feasible use;					
22	and					
23	WHEREAS, this plan focuses on families and businesses in need through					
24	Pandemic Response and Support for Vulnerable Populations and encouraging					
25	economic growth through Investments in Recovery; and					

	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque in partnership with the New Mexico
2	Department of Finance and Administration and local partners, announced on
3	April 15, 2021, that it will administer \$24,000,000 in federal funds for Emergency
4	Rental Assistance; and
5	WHEREAS, \$6,000,000 for Housing Vouchers was proposed in the FY21
6	Operating Budget; and this resolution proposes to appropriate additional
7	\$1,340,000 for Housing Vouchers, Eviction Prevention & Domestic Violence using
8	ARPA funding; and
9	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque appropriated \$3,300,000 for the
10	Affordable Housing in the FY21 Capital Program, and this resolution proposes an
11	additional \$3,400,000 for Affordable Housing and \$3,300,000 for Home
12	Rehabilitation Assistance; and
13	WHEREAS, the State appropriated \$110,000 for bikeway and walking trail
14	repairs and this resolution proposes an additional \$200,000; and
15	WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque desires to accept these funds, which
16	do not require a cash match.
17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF

19	Section 1. That the City of Albuquerque's request from the United States
20	Secretary of the Treasury for direct payment to units of local government as
21	established in Section 9901, Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds
22	of the America Rescue Plan Act of 2021, is hereby approved.
23	Section 2. That upon receipt, estimated funds in the amount of \$56,760,000
24	from the United States Department of the Treasury are hereby appropriated to the
25	City of Albuquerque in the Operating Grant Fund (265) for Fiscal Year 2022, 2023
26	and 2024.
27	Section 3. That the City of Albuquerque shall use the funds for the
