	9	SECTION 1. Findings and Intent. The City Council hereby finds that:

1	WHEREAS, Active Transportation is defined as any self-propelled, human-
2	powered mode of transportation, such as walking, bicycling, or using mobility
3	devices; and
4	WHEREAS, the 2015 Bikeways and Trails Facility plan recommended
5	restructuring of GABAC and GARTC in order to consider concerns beyond
6	those of just the bicycling community; and
7	WHEREAS, the City's Vision Zero initiative is a commitment to create safer
8	streets for all, regardless of our age or ability, whether we are walking, riding a
9	bicycle, using a mobility device, driving, or taking transit; and
10	WHEREAS, the City adopted a Complete Streets ordinance in 2015 (F/S O-
11	14-27), and updated the ordinance in 2019 (O-19-64), recommending the
12	formation of an active transportation advisory committee to address issues of
13	safety, public health, the environment, and equity for pedestrians and cyclists
14	using City streets; and
15	WHEREAS, at the October 2020 GABAC meeting, GABAC passed a
16	resolution calling for the adoption by ordinance of a reorganization of GABAC
17	to address not only the needs of on-street cyclists but those of pedestrians
18	and other non-automotive road users in ways that ensure equitable and safe
19	facilities throughout the Albuquerque area.
20	SECTION 2. Section §2-6-15 of ROA 1994 is hereby amended to read as
21	follows:
22	" § 2-6-15 CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE'S GREATER ALBUQUERQUE ACTIVE
23	TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE.
24	(A) Appointment.
25	(1) The Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall
26	appoint nine members of an advisory committee to be known as the City of
27	Albuquerque's Greater Albuquerque Active Transportation Committee,
28	(GAATC). The members shall be appointed by the city in the following manner,
29	with one of the members also representing the Environmental Planning
30	Commission:
31	(a) One member to represent Active Transportation users north

(a) One member to represent Active Transportation users north of I-40 and east of I-25.

1	(b) One member to represent Active Transportation users south
2	of I-40 and east of I-25.
3	(c) One member to represent Active Transportation users north
4	of I-40 and west of I-25.
5	(d) One member to represent Active Transportation users south
6	of I-40 and west of I-25.
7	(e) One member to represent older adults (over 60 years of age).
8	(f) One member to represent youth (under 24 years of age).
9	(g) One member to represent individuals with a disability.
10	(h) One member to represent pedestrians and transit users.
11	(i) One member to represent bicyclists.
12	(2) Each member shall understand and represent the needs of
13	residents, particularly Active Transportation users.
14	(3) For the purposes of the GAATC, Active Transportation is defined
15	as any self-propelled, human-powered mode of transportation, such as
16	walking, bicycling, or using mobility devices.
17	(4) In voting, in the case of a tie, a motion shall be deemed defeated.
18	(B) Duties, Responsibilities, Powers. The Committee shall:
19	(1) Advise City departments and other governmental entities,
20	including but not limited to the City Departments of Municipal Development
21	(DMD) and Parks & Recreation, the Environmental Planning Commission
22	(EPC), Bernalillo County, the Mid-Region Council of Governments, and the
23	New Mexico Department of Transportation, concerning plans, projects, and
24	programs in the greater Albuquerque area for bikeways, sidewalks, street
25	crossings, and on-street multi-use trails, including but not limited to the
26	Transportation Improvement Program and the Capital Improvements Program;
27	and
28	(2) Advise the City on Vision Zero and Complete Streets projects and
29	programs to support equitable, safe, and accessible Active Transportation
30	options; and
31	(3) Monitor all on-street pedestrian and bicycling facilities and
32	recommended implementation strategies for adopted plans for bikeways,

sidewalks, street crossings, and on-street multi-use trails; and

(4) Promote bicycling and other modes of Active Transportation in

	7	SECTION 3. COMPILATION. Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be
	8	incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, New
	9	Mexico, 1994.
	10	SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect five (5)
	11	days after publication by title and general summary.
