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WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Albuquerque (the "City") in the County of Bernalillo and State of New Mexico, has determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the City and its inhabitants to issue gross receipts tax revenue bonds in the principal amount of up to \$50,000,000 for the purpose to acquire property for, and to design, develop, erect, construct and otherwise improve a public stadium for multiple uses, including, but not limited to, professional soccer events (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Council has the power to submit the question of issuing gross receipts tax revenue bonds to the qualified electorate of the City pursuant to applicable laws of the State of New Mexico, the City Charter and the City's home rule power pursuant to Article X, Section 6 of the New Mexico

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1	WHEREAS, the Council hereby determines and declares that the Project for
2	which the question of issuing the City's gross receipts tax bonds (the "Bond
3	Election Question") as set forth herein will be for public purposes: and

WHEREAS, a regular local election is scheduled to be held in the City of Albuquerque on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November, 2021, and shall include the **Bond Election Question.**

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 8 ALBUQUERQUE:

Section 1. All action, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution, heretofore taken by the Council and the officers of the City directed toward the Bond Election Question and the Project, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the calling and holding of an election to authorize the issuance of the gross receipts tax revenue bonds (the "GRT Bonds") to finance the Project, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 2. At the next regular local election to be held in the City on November 2, 2021 (such regular local election being sometimes referred to herein as the "Election"), there shall be submitted to the City's qualified electors the Bond Election Question set forth in Section 5 hereof.

The City's qualified electors are eligible to vote on candidates, questions and Bond Election Question being submitted at the Election.

All persons desiring to vote for any candidate or on any questions being submitted at the Election must be registered to vote. Any person who is otherwise qualified to vote and who is not currently registered to vote may register at the office of the Bernalillo County Clerk, 6th Floor, One Civic Plaza, Albuquerque, New Mexico, or at the office of any duly appointed deputy registration officer, as authorized by law.

Section 5. This Resolution and the Bond Election Question shall be submitted to the Bernalillo County Clerk to conduct the Election in accordance with the Local Election Act, Section 1-22-1 through -20, NMSA 1978, as amended. The Bond Election Question shall be in substantially the following form:

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13	Section 6. The election on the Bond Election Question shall be held and
14	conducted in accordance with the Bond Election Act and the Election Code of
15	the City Charter.
16	Section 7. The Bond Election Resolution shall be published in the
17	English and Spanish languages at least once a week for four consecutive
18	weeks by four insertions, the first insertion being published between fifty (50)
19	and sixty (60) days before the day of the Election in a newspaper of
20	newspapers which are of general circulation in the City and which otherwise
21	qualify as legal newspapers in the City.
22	Section 8. For further information concerning this Election, consult the
23	Office of the County Clerk, 6th Floor, One Civic Plaza, Albuquerque, New
24	Mexico.
25	Section 9 The officers of the City be and they bereby are authorized and

directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Resolution.

Section 10. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provisions shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution. Council hereby declares that it would have passed this resolution and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word, or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

Section 11. All resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any resolution or ordinance, or parts thereof, heretofore repealed.

SUBJECT: Resolution: Authorizes Submittal of a Bond Election Resolution for the Potential Issuance of \$50,000,000 for a multi-use public stadium.

The attached Resolution would authorize the City to submit a bond election question for the November 2, 2021 election proposing the issuance of gross receipts tax bonds in the amount of \$50,000,000 to acquire property for, and to design, develop, erect, construct and otherwise improve a public stadium for multiple uses, including, but not limited to, professional soccer events.

The Resolution provides for a public vote on the community's support for a multi-use stadium for professional soccer as well as other events. Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

The attached Resolution would authorize the City to submit a bond election question for the November 2, 2021 election proposing the issuance of gross receipts tax bonds in the amount of \$50,000,000 to acquire property for, and to design, develop, erect, construct and otherwise improve a public stadium or arena for multiple uses, including, but not limited to, professional soccer events.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

The Resolution provides for a public vote on the community's support for a multi-use stadium for professional soccer as well as other events. If the bond question is approved by a majority of voters at the November 2nd election, the City would then move forward with the issuance of the gross receipts tax bonds for the capital improvements. The bonds would be paid from the City's share of state-shared gross receipts tax revenues and will not be a general obligation of the City.

3. Why is the project needed?

The Project is needed to provide a new venue for professional soccer in the City as well as a venue for other events and uses for the City and its residents.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The proposed gross receipts tax bonds will potentially be issued in the principal amount of \$50,000,000. The bonds will be payable from the City's share of state-shared gross receipts tax revenues and will not be general obligations of the City. The total costs will depend on the interest rates and terms of the bonds when issued.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?

6. What will happen if the project is not approved?

If the Resolution is not adopted, the question of issuing up to \$50,000,000 in gross receipts tax bonds will not be presented to the eligible voters at the November 2, 2021 election.
