1 MEMORIAL
2 THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE REAFFIRMS ITS STRONG COMMITMENT TO END
3 THE DRIVERS OF CRIME, INCLUDING CRIMINAL FIREARM USE AND
4 RECIDIVISM.

5 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Police Department continues to arrest the same
6 violent offenders over and over again – THE REVOLVING DOOR; and

7 WHEREAS, for the first six months of 2021, the Albuquerque Police
8 Department reports that preliminary crime statistics indicate that there have
9 been 31,438 crimes; and

10 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque can continue to seek criminal justice
11 reform while also holding repeat violent criminals accountable; and

12 WHEREAS, concerning low-level offenders, there exists the need to increase
13 the use of pre-prosecution diversion programs; and

14 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque currently offers the Violence Intervention
15 Program (VIP), and works with a number of diversion programs including Law
16 Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) and Young Adult Court; and

17 WHEREAS, concerning individuals who commit violent and property crimes
18 with a firearm, these individuals need to be criminally prosecuted and held
19 accountable; and

20 WHEREAS, this year, the City of Albuquerque will pass its record number of
21 homicides; and

22 WHEREAS, three Albuquerque Police Officers were recently wounded, one
23 critically, after engaging an armed robber. The gunman has a felony record from
24 California; and

1 WHEREAS, in 2015, Albuquerque Police Officer Daniel Webster was
2 murdered by a convicted felon with a handgun during a routine traffic stop; and

3 WHEREAS, in 2015, Rio Rancho Police Department Officer Gregg “Nigel”
4 Benner was murdered by a convicted felon with a handgun during a routine
5 traffic stop; and

6 WHEREAS, recently, a homicide suspect removed his ankle bracelet and was
7 on the loose without law enforcement being notified.

8 BE IT MEMORIALIZED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
9 CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:

10 SECTION 1. The Council strongly supports the Albuquerque Police
11 Department, and other local, county, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement
12 agencies.

13 SECTION 2. The Council urges that a 24/7 comprehensive GPS tracking
14 monitoring system be put into place by the courts and that the Albuquerque
15 Police Department be notified immediately when a defendant absconds.

16 SECTION 3. The Council urges the District Attorney, Attorney General and
17 United States Attorney to prosecute and hold accountable with significant
18 prison time individuals who use firearms in the commission of violent and
19 property crimes.

20 SECTION 4. The Council urges the District Court to hold accountable with
21 significant prison time individuals who use firearms in the commission of violent
22 and property crimes.

23 SECTION 5. The Council urges the New Mexico State Legislature to pass and
24 close loopholes in the laws which hold accountable with significant prison time
25 individuals who use firearms in the commission of violent and property crimes.

26 SECTION 6. The Council urges the Governor to support legislation which
27 holds accountable with significant prison time individuals who use firearms in
28 the commission of violent and property crimes.

29 SECTION 7. The City Clerk is directed to distribute copies of this Memorial to
30 the Chief of the Albuquerque Police Department.

31 SECTION 8. The City Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Memorial to
32 each member of the New Mexico State Legislature representing the State

1 districts in the City of Albuquerque, and the Bernalillo County Commission, the
2 Chief of the New Mexico State Police Department, the Second Judicial District
3 Attorney's Office, the Offices of the Speaker of the House and President Pro
4 Tem of the New Mexico Legislature, and the Office of the New Mexico Attorney
5 General.
