



associations may limit associations in areas where coalitions are the only association and their bylaws may restrict participation; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Neighborhood Coordination is still in the process of working toward an improved NARO, and has completed the Neighborhood Engagement Process in order to develop a series of recommendations to support the update of the NARO; and

WHEREAS, a draft of a revised NARO is near completion, and it is the sponsor's intent to distribute the draft to neighborhood associations and coalitions city-wide by the end of the calendar year for input prior to introduction at City Council in early 2021; and

WHEREAS, new recognized and non-recognized associations should be allowed to form under certain circumstances during the update process; and

WHEREAS, in order to grant additional time for public review of the draft NARO, the expiration date of R-17-233, Enactment Number R-2017-095 needs to be extended.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE:

SECTION 1. In Section 3 of R-17-233, Enactment Number R-2017-095, on page 2 line 23 strike December 31, 2020 and replace with June 30, 2021 so that the section is amended to read as follows:

This resolution expires upon the sooner of the next enactment to amend the NARO in relation to the establishment of neighborhood associations or June 30, 2021.
