SUBJECT: VETO OF R-26-12, ADJUSTING FISCAL YEAR 2026 OPERATING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CERTAIN FUNDS AND PROGRAMS.

DATE: APRIL 20, 2026

As I stated in my previous line-item veto of C/S R-25-132, I support Bands of Enchantment. But my concerns regarding the appropriation of City funds to a private, for-profit business remain the same. It's my understanding that support for this appropriation was part of a broader agreement, and I respect Council's work to come to an agreement on important City issues. However, as with the prior appropriation, there are serious legal concerns about an appropriation of this amount to a private business. In particular:

- This would bring the total appropriation for Bands of Enchantment to \$860,000 for FY26. There is an additional appropriation of \$580,000 proposed for FY27. In total, this for-profit business is in line to receive approximately \$1.4 million in City funding.
- An expenditure of this amount to a private business violates the anti-donation clause. In addition, an appropriation of this amount to a business without a public procurement

process likely violates the City's Procurement Ordinance. Also, the Council transferred the authority this funding to itself, in violation of the principles of separation of powers.

Therefore, because I cannot support legislation that is unlawful, I have decided to veto R-26-12. I respect that this veto can be overridden, however if these funds are appropriated it will require legal action before this administration violates the law. A simple solution would be to appropriate money for tourist-related activities and marketing. That would avoid these difficult issues and any violation of City ordinances or the New Mexico Constitution.

5 series that is filmed in Albuquerque and celebrates live music performances
6 across multiple genres, including rock, indie, hip-hop, folk, Latinx, and more;

9 through digital streaming platforms such as Tubi, Prime Video, the Roku
10 Channel, and All Arts; and

11 WHEREAS, *Bands of Enchantment* has produced multiple seasons

13 performance tapings at iconic Albuquerque venues such as the historic KiMo
14 Theatre and the Rail Yards; and

15 WHEREAS, recent seasons of the series have included a free outdoor
16 *Bands of Enchantment Music Festival* in downtown Albuquerque, expanding
17 the reach of the television production into large-scale public music
18 experiences that promote community gathering and cultural enrichment; and

19 WHEREAS, providing free and accessible public music events such as the
20 *Bands of Enchantment Music Festival* supports community connection,
21 cultural participation, and quality-of-life opportunities for Albuquerque
22 residents across all ages and backgrounds; and

23 WHEREAS, the City of Albuquerque's Department of Arts & Culture
24 partners with *Bands of Enchantment* and its producers to present red carpet
25 premieres and associated events that showcase the City's creative energy and
26 elevate Albuquerque's presence in national media; and
