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RESOLUTION

DEDICATING STATE CAPITAL OUTLAY FUNDS TO SPECIFIC PROJECTS AND
PHASES AND REQUIRING COUNCIL APPROVAL OF SCOPE CHANGES.

WHEREAS, each year priorities are established for State Capital Outlay
requests through a combination of recommendations from community
members, city staff, state legislators, and city councilors; and

WHEREAS, these priorities are vetted by professional staff for achievability
and funding needs; and

WHEREAS, city councilors present this information to state legislators with
an assurance that the project will be executed as discussed, with the
understanding that some adjustments may become necessary; and

WHEREAS, city councilors continually update state legislators on progress
on projects; and

WHEREAS, when departments deviate from the agreed upon plans, it
undermines the trust and partnerships which have been established between
the City and State.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF
ALBUQUERQUE:

SECTION 1. Consistent with the funding priorities developed in
partnership with the State, funding associated with the following sources shall
be spent as specified:

(1) Lomas Traffic Calming Project:

(a) Funds associated with State Grants K3180, J3249, and H3289 shall
be expended on the Lomas Traffic Calming Project.

(2) Sandia High School Area Traffic Calming:

1 (a) Funds associated with State Grant I3263 are to be spent on the
2 remaining items associated with the Sandia High School Area Traffic Calming
3 Project.

4 (b) Funds associated with State Grant K2681 shall be expended first on
5 the Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon crossing associated with the Sandia
6 High School Area Traffic Calming.

7 (3) GSI Funding:

8 (a) Funds associated with State Grant J2344 shall be used to cover
9 Green Stormwater Infrastructure elements included in the Girard Blvd Traffic
10 Calming Project, San Pedro Mainstreet & Streetscaping Project, and Workers
11 Memorial Park.

12 (4) Lomas Blvd Medians:

13 (a) Funds associated with State Grant H3289 are to be expended first on
14 the medians on Lomas Blvd from San Pedro Blvd to Louisiana Blvd.

15 ~~(b) A work order shall be in place by September 30, 2026 for this~~
16 ~~segment.~~

17 (5) Los Altos Park Wayfinding:

18 (a) Funds remaining in State Grant J2784 are to be expended first on
19 creating and installing wayfinding signage in Los Altos Park.

20 (6) Lead Avenue and Coal Avenue:

21 (a) Funds associated with State Grant J2839 are to be expended for
22 traffic calming in City Council District 6 with at least \$250,000 to be expended
23 on Coal and Lead Avenues within City Council District 6.

24 [(7) Alb Teen Recreation Center Ren

25 (a) Funds associated with State Grant K2797 are to be expended for
26 renovating the Historic Heights Community Center into a dedicated hub for
27 teen programming. Funding will support planning, equip, furnish, design,
28 construction, and improvements to the facility's spaces, technology, and
29 safety features with at least \$200,000.]

30 SECTION 2. Any proposed changes to these scopes shall [require prior
31 approval by the City Council.] [be agreed upon in writing with the City
32 Councilor representing that district.]

1 **SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.** If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause,
2 word, or phrase of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or
3 unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not
4 affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution. The Council
5 hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and each section,
6 paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any
7 provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

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
