SUBJECT: Approval to apply for grant funding through the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the NM Department of Transportation (NM DOT) for the Double Eagle II Airport Taxiways B & C Lighting Rehabilitation design project.


For your consideration, the Aviation Department requests approval to apply for federal and state grant funding to design the rehabilitation of the Double Eagle II Airport Taxiways B & C lighting system. This project will replace failing quartz halogen lighting and signage with LED fixtures. The existing system was installed in 2006, and the fixtures and transformers are failing, with replacement parts difficult to obtain due to the technology shift to LED.


The total project cost is \$91,762.00. The Aviation Department intends to apply for \$82,585.00 through the FAA, and \$4,588.00 from the NM DOT, with a total grant match requirement of \$4,589.00. The cost share for this project is 90% Federal, 5% NM DOT, and 5% City match. The matching funds will come from existing appropriations within the department's capital fund.



Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

Approval to apply for grant funding through the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the NM Department of Transportation (NM DOT) for the Double Eagle II Airport Taxiways B & C Lighting Rehabilitation design project.

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

Request permission to apply for grant funding for the design of Double Eagle II airport taxiways B & C Lighting Rehabilitation design project.

3. Why is this project needed?

This project will design the replacement of the existing quartz halogen lighting and signage with LED fixtures. The existing system was installed in 2006, and the fixtures and transformers are failing and replacement parts are difficult to obtain due to the industry's move to LED technology. Additionally, the existing guidance signs are faded, and delaminating and replacement bulbs and circuitry for the existing guidance signs are also difficult to find due to the LED technology shift in the industry.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

The total project cost is \$91,762.00. The Aviation Department intends to apply for \$82,585.00 through the FAA, and \$4,588.00 from the NM DOT, with a total grant match requirement of \$4,589.00. The cost share for this is 90% Federal, 5% NM DOT, and 5% City match. The matching funds will come from existing appropriations within the department's capital fund.

If not approved, the Department would lose the opportunity to seek grant funding and would have to cover the full cost of the design phase of the project through the capital fund, potentially delaying this project.

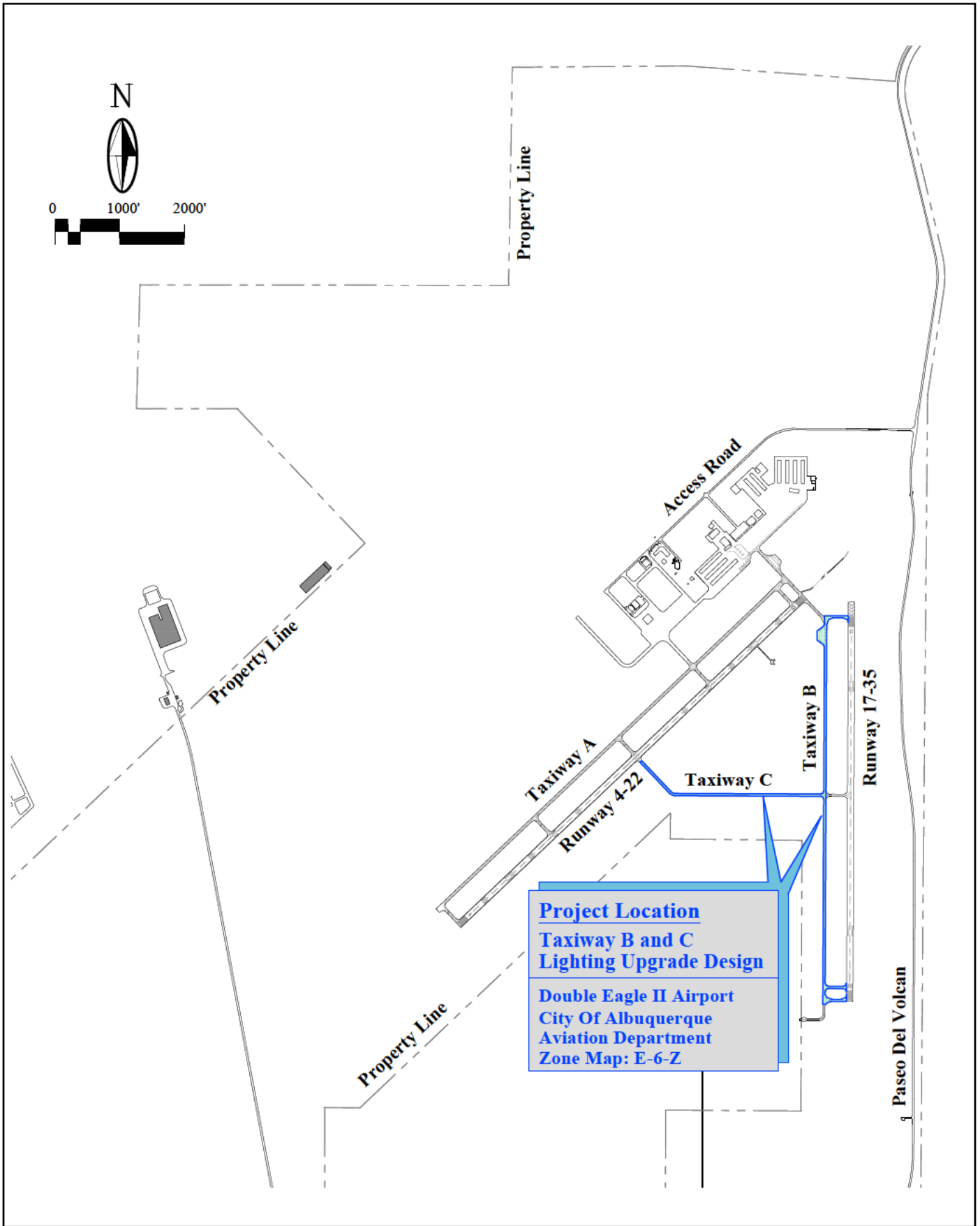

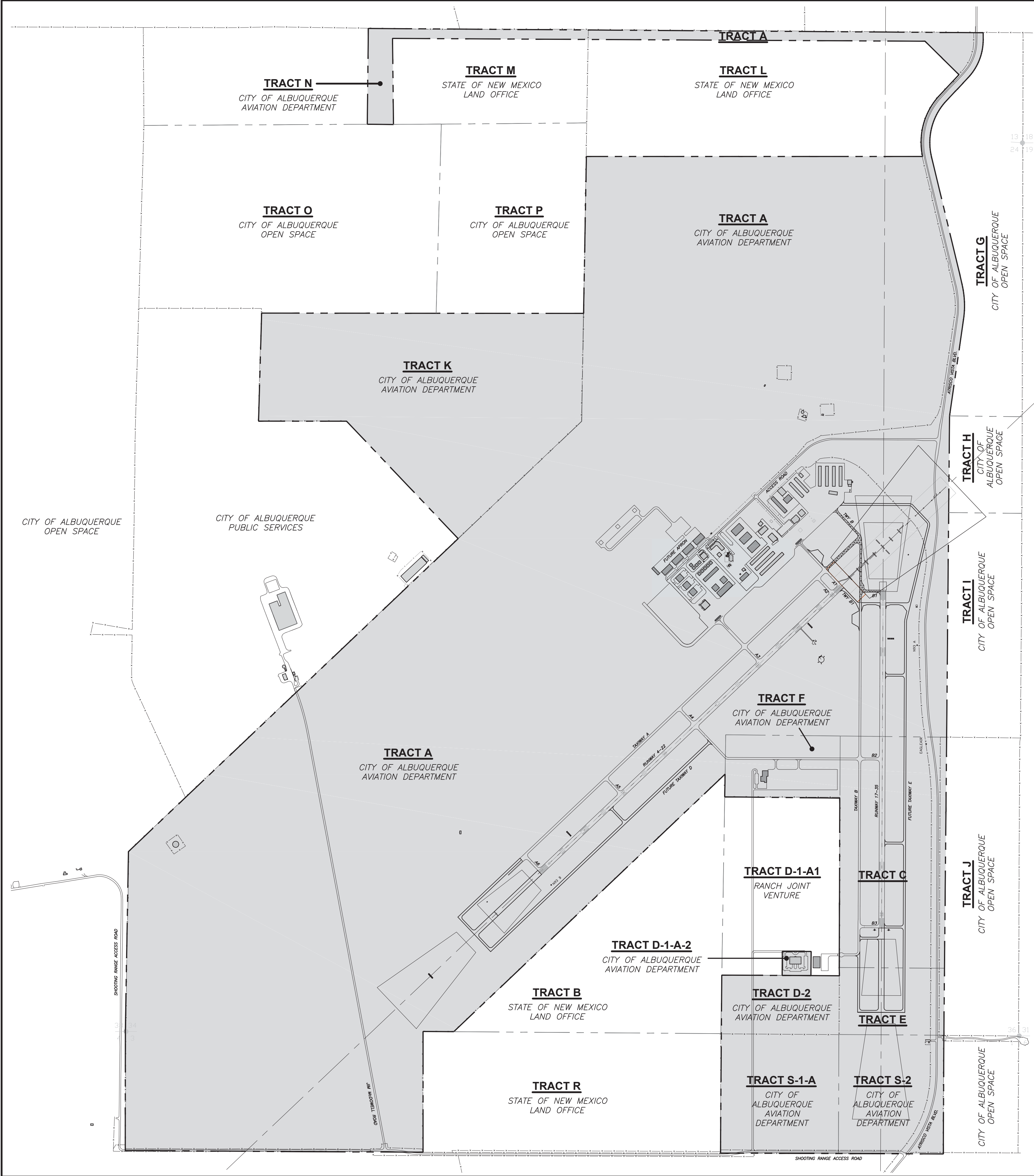

Existing wiring will be checked during desing and replacement included in the project if the condition warrants.</p>
<p>2. Benefits Anticipated:</p> <p>Provide upgraded and dependable airfield lighting and signage for the parallel taxiway to Runway 17-5 (Taxiway B) and the midfield Taxiway C. The existing system has fixture outages that are difficult to repair - quartz halogen and incandescent lighting fixtures are not readily available or manufactured in the U.S.</p>

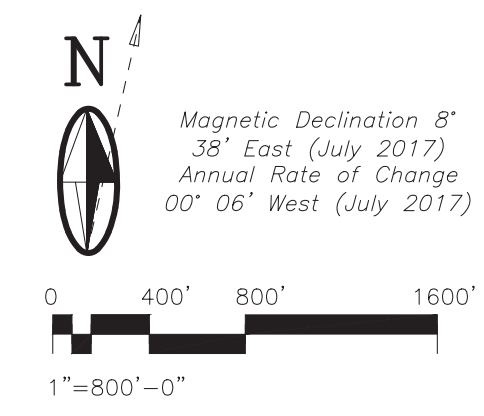
